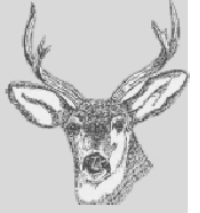

### Infants looking back at last week

We had another great forest school session where we examined the footprints of a variety of animals, went on a successful bear hunt and enjoyed hot chocolate and marshmallows. We started to think about our favourite fairy tales, what the criteria might be for a story to be a fairy tale and shared a very traditional version of Cinderella. Reception enjoyed the French story 'Barbapapa' before making their own story board. In Maths they had fun doubling numbers to 10 using coloured plastic eggs to double the number in the egg box.

### Infants Looking forward to next week

We will consider whether Cinderella's fairy godmother made a mistake by making glass slippers and will look at what other materials could have been used. We will build our own houses based on the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' and test them to see which would be the most difficult to blow down. In preparation for future weeks... if any pupils have a story book with flaps, sliders or levers we would love to borrow them. If they have a shoe that they have grown out of that we could use for an art project (this one won't be coming home fit to wear!) then we would like to start collecting them for use in a few weeks time. In Maths Reception will be making a repeating pattern by making fruit kebabs on skewers. They will count on in 2s and make repeating patterns using shapes, animals and coloured bears. Reception will write a letter and a postcard to send next week, practising their handwriting skills.

### Lower Juniors looking back at last week

We had a great time at the EIS Sport Athletics tournament on Tuesday with everyone getting involved with different athletics events including, javelin, high jump, long jump, chest push, shot put and various running races. They all put in great effort and tried their best! In Maths we looked at Money. Y3's recapped on pounds and pence and found ways to make different amounts. Y4's wrote money as decimals. In Literacy, we read more of our text 'Who Let the Gods Out?' finding out about how Elliot and Virgo meet and their mission to find Prisoner Forty Two.

### Lower Juniors looking forward to next week

In Science we will carry out different observations to find out the permeability, durability and density of different groups of rocks. In Topic, we will look at the importance of the Olympics in Ancient Greece, how it started and what it involved. In Literacy, we will begin to plan our own versions of Greek Myths and will use information from our text to help plan a story. In Maths, we will continue adding and subtracting amounts of money, finding change and carrying out some problem solving questions. In Computing, we will put the finishing touches to the coding for our driverless car Scratch games.

### Upper Juniors looking back at last week

We enjoyed the athletics day at the EIS Stadium on Tuesday, participating in track and field competitions against other schools—we even came home with some medals! In Literacy we started our new text, 'When Stars are Scattered', finding out about Omar and Hussan living in Dadaab refugee camp in Kenya. In computing we found out how a game is created and works ready to design and make one of our own.

### Upper Juniors looking forward to next week

In Maths Y6 will create climate graphs from given data as part of their holiday planning project. Y5 will continue to work on decimals and percentages. In Literacy pupils will read some more of 'When Stars are Scattered' and write a balanced argument exploring why Omar should or should not go to school. We will find out about the ancient Olympics in our History topic work and continue with Evolution in Science by exploring fossils.

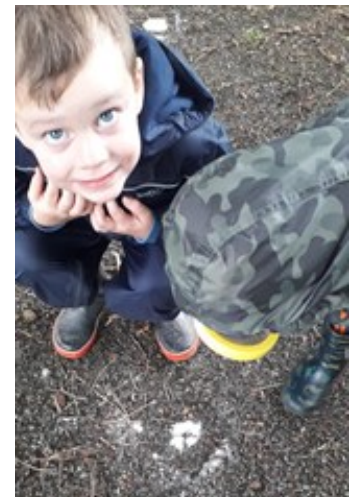
