The infants' topic for the first half term will be 'Incredible Me!' We will be naming and finding out



about human body parts, including how we change with age and how our senses help us to interpret the world around us. We will think about different needs that people may have and design pizzas for groups of

children that cater for their preferences and

any dietary requirements. Children will have the opportunity to create a family tree and a timeline of their lives so far as well as thinking about things they are looking forward to being able to do in the future. We will look at maps of





our local area and also see how far around the world the children have family links. We will be studying the portrait work of Andy Warhol and creating our own self portraits in his style using colours that best reflect our personalities and the things that are special to us.

In Year 5 and 6 we will be doing a historybased theme about the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons looking at historical evidence to explore the impact these groups of people had on daily life. We will be reading the book 'The Warrior Troll' by Rachael Lindsay and we will be also be looking at different versions of the epic poem 'Beowulf'. Throughout this work we will be writing narratives in the style of Rachael Lindsay and using inspiration from Beowulf, we will also be writing hero myths. As well as this we will write be writing instructions, a discussion text and creating our own troll dictionaries. Our first topic in the new year will be place value in maths and in science we will be starting with the 'Light' topic. The children will be looking at how light travels, reflection and refraction as well as making their own periscopes. For the second half of the term the children will be exploring the topic of Materials and their



properties. In Art the children will be creating their own Viking jewellery and helmets. Year 3 and 4 science and topic – The children will be exploring sound and carrying out different experiments to find out about vibrations. They will be looking at different instruments and how to make

a low and high pitch sound. The second half of the first

term will be the electricity topic where they will be exploring simple circuits and experimenting with the equipment.

Our theme will be 'Our DNA' and we will be focusing on the Vikings and Anglo-Saxon and the

impact they had on daily life. We will be finding out about their place in History and where and how they invaded Britain.
