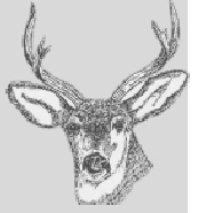

## Celebrating Our Week

Friday 27th September 2024

### Infants looking back at last week

Y2 pupils successfully completed their place value unit assessments. We continued practicing counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and ordering groups of numbers. We wrote lists of things we would include in a castle or rocket design before drawing the designs labelling items from our list. We created our own self-portraits in the style of Salvador Dali's work 'Couple with heads full of cloud'. We used our senses to sort fruit and vegetables and thought about words to describe them. Reception enjoyed the story "Little Rabbit Foo Foo", before making their own version using speech marks and finding out why we use them. In Maths Reception had fun finding about 2D shapes, naming and counting their properties before finding lots of different 2D shapes outside in the environment.

### Infants Looking forward to next week

We will start work on repetitive poems and songs and use rhyming patterns to add our own verses. We will think about how we communicate with people online and what information is safe to share. We will read the story of The Lost Son and ponder what this parable tells us about what Christians believe God is like. We will use our taste and smell senses to explore different foods. Reception's story will be "Mog The Forgetful Cat" and they will find out about the author Judith Karr, comparing a variety of Mog books to find out which is their favourite. In Maths they will learn 3D shapes, sort a variety of packages into each 3D category and look at the difference between 2D and 3D shapes.

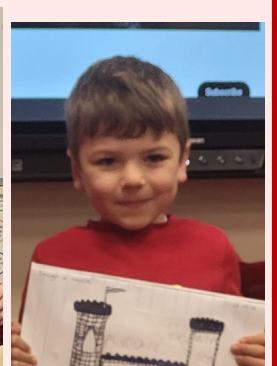
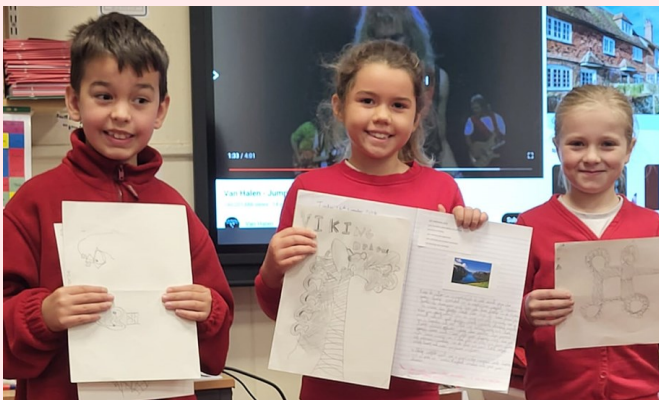
### Juniors looking back at last week

Y5/6 have read more of 'Warrior Troll' before debating whether it was a good idea or not for Thom to go to Bergen. They completed their periscopes and explored refraction in Science. Y6 started addition, subtraction, multiplication and division in maths and Y5 worked on place value. Y3/4 continued work on place value, placing numbers up to 10000 on number lines. In Literacy they selected exciting adjectives to describe a setting. In Science Y3/4 explored pitch and how to make low and high sounds. All of the juniors have taken part in the Speak Out. Stay Safe programme run by the NSPCC in collective worship and in their PSHE lessons. They have also been finding out about events which occurred during the Viking era and then ordered them on a timeline.

### Juniors looking forward to next week

Y5/6 will continue with their balanced argument deciding whether Thom should go to Bergen or not. We will be finishing our work on refraction and starting to explore spectrums. In Art the children will be looking at designs of Viking jewellery with a view to designing their own. Y3/4 will be continuing with place value, will be trying to interpret troll language and in science will be making their own instruments which demonstrate pitch. As well as this they will be using clues to carry out a 'Who am I?' game in computing by using their internet search skills. All the juniors will be designing and creating their long boat topic book front covers and finishing their Viking timelines.
