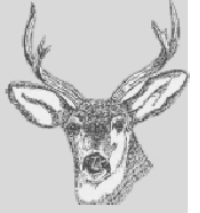

Infants looking back at last week

We shared a range of poems, found and clapped their rhyming patterns and created our own versions of them. We looked at our local area, identified what we liked about living here and identified human and physical geographical features. We used our senses of touch, smell and taste exploring different foods before using descriptive words for things our senses told us about them. We considered what information it is wise to share or keep private when we are online and we shared the story of The Lost Son and what Christians believe the story tells them about what God is like. Reception enjoyed "Mog The Cat" books by Judith Kerr. In Maths they named and counted the properties of 3D shapes before sorting lots of different 3D packages out and enjoying a chocolate hidden in a 3D box.

Infants Looking forward to next week

We will be doing lots of work with adding different groups of objects and recording our work as calculations. We are going to design our own locality, with features and facilities we would like it to have. We will be exploring the portraits of Andy Warhol and trying our hand at screen printing before making multiple copies of images of ourselves. Next week the Reception are in for a surprise when the Tiger will come for Tea during a little tea party that they will make. In Maths the Reception will be looking at numbers up to 10 and counting on one more from a specific number.

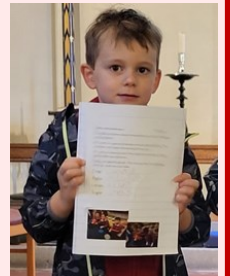
Juniors looking back at last week

In Y5/6 pupils wrote balanced arguments about whether Thom from 'The Warrior Troll' should go to Bergen or not to sell the Viking treasure. Y3/4 used prepositions to describe where Viking treasure might be and interpreted Troll Language. In Science Y5/6 worked on refraction by carrying out an experiment to see refraction in action and started to explore spectrums. In Y3/4 pupils made their own pan pipes and discovered lots of things about pitch and the vibrations causing sound. In Maths, Y3/4 rounded numbers and Y5/6 have worked on calculations. All of the juniors worked on their topic book covers incorporating a Viking longship which they designed themselves.

Juniors looking forward to next week

Year 5/6 will read more of 'The Warrior Troll' to find out if Thom does go to Bergen before thinking about what might happen next in the story. We will complete story maps to decide on the next events before writing a narrative. Y5 will start addition and subtraction in maths and Y6 will continue with multiplication and division. In science we will make colour wheels to demonstrate the spectrum. Y3/4 will research and describe Viking treasure in Literacy, whilst in Maths they will complete their place value unit by looking at roman numerals. All of the juniors will research Anglo-Saxon life including aspects of homes, work and religion before starting to use the research to compare Viking life to Anglo-Saxons.
