Infants looking back at last week

Having written out party invites and made sandwiches, Reception had a lovely surprise when the tiger came to their tea party and ate all the buns on the plate! They thought of some super alliteration using 2 of their favourite books. In Maths they counted the passengers on an imaginary train and used Numicon pieces to make numbers to ten. KS1 partitioned numbers in lots of ways to make addition calculations. They wrote funny poems based on a conversation between an adult and a small child who was very keen to know 'why?'. They found out about Andy Warhol through the story 'Uncle Andy' and tried their hand at screen printing to learn about how he created some of his best known portraits.

Infants Looking forward to next week

Reception will read the story 'Knock, Knock Who's There?' and will think about, describe and draw the characters in the book. Reception will have fun showing and telling each other about their favourite piece of clothing from home. In Maths they will write a simple addition sum by counting sheep in a pen and will do lots of other counting and sorting using part-whole models. KS1 will identify what a balanced diet looks like and how it keeps us healthy. We will taste a variety of pizza toppings and design one that suits everyone. We will find out more about how to keep ourselves safe online and think of our own additions to the story 'Oi, Get Off Our Train!'.

Juniors looking back at last week

In Y5/6 we planned and wrote our own narrative in the style of Rachael Lindsay. We used different sentence types, creating tension to make our audience want to read on. Y3/4 researched Viking treasures and created a non-chronological report. In Science Y5/6 found out how Isaac Newton discovered that light was made up of all the colours of the spectrum and some pupils made colour wheels. Y3/4 made string telephones and had great fun trying them out. They also looked at Viking jewellery in Art ready to design and make their own. Everyone started to research how Anglo-Saxons lived and completed their lovely topic book front covers.

Juniors looking forward to next week

Y5/6 will finish their narratives as well as watching a short video of a Viking village to inspire them when writing poetry. Y3/4 will plan and write a diary entry as Thom and will start their unit on addition and subtraction. In Science Y5/6 will look at colour filters and explore what colours objects look when using filters. In Maths Y5 will continue with addition and subtraction and Y6 will do long multiplication and division. In Y3/4 pupils will use their advanced internet search skills to find a mystery thief and where the thief is located from a series of clues. All the juniors will be collating their research and information they have about Anglo-Saxons to complete posters about all aspects of their life.

Best work of the week was awarded to Ralph, Matthew, Walter, Arlo, Charlie, Etta, Thia-Louise, Belle and Eliza










